#### Overview

The Folsom Lake College library curriculum teaches vital research skills that enable students to achieve success in their college classes, careers, and day-to-day lives. Students will gain "research survival skills" to cope with the information-rich environment in which we live. They will develop the ability to access information from a broad range of resources and to evaluate this information and its sources. Course study will include information from print, online subscription databases, and the internet.

Students will learn about the research process, including developing search strategies, finding relevant sources, and critically evaluating information. The skills acquired in this course are applicable to academic research, on-the-job research, and lifelong learning.

- develop strategies for identifying, exploring, and refining a research topic,
- effectively search for different types of information using a wide variety of research tools,
- evaluate sources for currency, relevance, authority, accuracy, point of view or bias, and accessibility,
- use information ethically by giving credit to the original ideas of others and avoiding plagiarism.
