Agreement for the Articulation of Transfer of College Credit 2019-2020

By this document, **Folsom Lake College** and **Sierra Nevada College** enter into an agreement for the benefit of both institutions and their students. Specifically, this agreement stipulates how Folsom Lake College (FLC) students may apply credits earned at FLC to fulfill Sierra Nevada College (SNC) degree and program requirements.

This articulation agreement provides a listing of direct transfer courses for the General Education and Core Curriculum at Sierra Nevada College. If you are interested in a listing of the lower division courses within your specific major, please send your official transcript to SNC with your application, or contact the SNC Office of the Registrar.

GRADE REQUIREMENT: SNC will accept, as transferable credit, only courses in which the student earned a grade of 'C' or higher. The College does not accept 'C-' or lower grades for transfer.

Sierra Nevada College courses are listed on the left – Folsom Lake College courses on the right. A minimum of 42 semester credits toward the degree must be upper division. Students must also take a minimum of 45 credits from SNC for a degree to be awarded.
