**I. Updates from each program**

- City College (Kelly)
  - 14 faculty members, that teach 35 sections that we're offering
  - Launching of spring internship with Sac PD
    - Internship started this month; civilian position to sworn, wrap students into entry level positions
  - Mock trial club with pre-law program, geared towards equity
    - Group of 20 who are interested
    - Last semester, dept looked at data for past five years, and found sub-group of students that haven't been successful
    - Efforts arose, such as a scholarship
    - How was outreach? Teaches Canvas, and is able to communicate to students instantly, so wasn't difficult
  - Honors course
    - 40% of them are going off onto a four-year school
    - UCs are looking at honors students faster than students with certificates
  - High School partnerships
  - Applied to Strong Workforce Program funding
  - Speaker Series
    - Broaden reach in community, and act as connector between students and employers
    - Have agencies that are resources within the criminal justice system (i.e, courts, probation departments)
    - Agencies want to come and present
    - Can be accessible K-12; Kelly and Mark will follow up
  - Online Format
    - 17-24 year olds love online
    - We're reaching students far past North Far North
    - Tons of corrections workers in classes to get salary bump
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- Folsom Lake College (Nando)
  - Two full time faculty; 12 classes/semester
  - Classes used to max out at 40 students/class; but lower enrollment due to virtual format
  - Internship with District Attorney
  - Prison program has faculty go and teach in classrooms, while prison inmates come to class and talk to students
  - Most students now are trying to get a four year degree
  - We're focusing on all aspects of law enforcement; broaden our lens for different entry points

- While FLC has Interest in hybrid, ARC does not want academies online
- Online format
  - Our students aren't the most tech savvy and do well in cohorts
  - We want to maintain high percentage of women and social justice focus, which the cohort experience contributes to
- New full time faculty that teaches at Rancho Cordova Center
- (Dennis)
  - Administrative Justice is housed out of behavioral health social division
- American River College
  - Shorthanded on staff, so it's difficult to manage the big program
  - AJ and academy side of it
